March 2025 Community Council Draft Minutes

Details of some items discussed at the Meeting held on 18th March 2025 at the Is-y-coed Village Hall. The Chair welcomed Cllr Angela Rhodes onto the Community Council.

Matters Arising: A reply had been received from WCBC in regard to the complaint of noise issues from James Jones & Sons Ltd. Further investigations are taking place.

National Eisteddfod-The meeting was attended by Betsan Moses and her colleague Gwenllian from the National Eisteddfod Committee. Both were welcomed to the meeting by the Chairman. The National Eisteddfod will take place in Isycoed on 35 acres of land opposite the old Nags Head Public House from 2nd to the 9th of August this year. Members were concerned how the traffic management would be arranged for such a major event, which could attract up to 50,000 visitors per day during the week. It was explained that with the help of Transport of Wales and WCBC, a co-ordinated traffic plan was being drawn up. It was proposed to make the event as 'green' as possible by operating shuttle services between the train stations and taxi ranks to cut down on car travel and ease traffic in the area. A communications plan prior to the event will ensure all Isycoed residents are fully informed of final traffic arrangements.

On the Eisteddfod site there will be parking for up to 5,000 vehicles and a 1,000 pitch caravan park. A schedule of time slots will be drawn up allocating caravans' arrival and exit times to cause as little congestion as possible to the area. Access and Exit sites are still to be finalised but any hedges requiring removal for access splays will be fully re-instated after the event by the National Eisteddfod. There will be various pavilions on the site as well as a youth village for camping. Sound checks will be ongoing during the event to cause as few noise issues as possible. The BBC will be present for the entire event with approx. 75 hours of live broadcasting planned. Cllr Mike Morris guestioned whether the ecology of the 35-acre site would be protected and assurance was given that this was the case. The Chairman questioned whether the overgrown grass verges on roads in the village can be cut back prior to the event for site traffic to pass any local traffic as easily as possible.

Isycoed Community Agent The meeting was attended by the new Isycoed Community Agent Tom Martin. Tom explained his role to members and how he is able to help the over 50s in the community in applying for bus passes and blue badges, and also signposting them for relevant financial help with benefit or debt support. Tom is going to be calling at the Community Hub on Thursday mornings at the Village Hall to offer support. He left flyers to be distributed with the next copy of the Issue with his contact details on.

Finance

It was resolved to use the £100 remaining in the Community Fund budget for the Community Hub.

Village Hall

Bookings: The Clerk updated members on bookings and enquiries received. It was agreed to contact the National Eisteddfod Committee with regard to using the field behind the village hall for caravan parking during the Eisteddfod week.

Correspondence One Voice Wales membership renewal invite - it was agreed to renew at a cost of £100 per annum WCBC - Street lighting SLA - noted this had been renewed for the next financial

VE Day Celebrations An update was given by the Chairman on preparations for VE Day celebrations on the 8th May. Flags and bunting have been ordered, Wine and soft drinks still to be purchased. The Clerk will contact the chip van to request he stays later on that evening, Cllr Brereton Thomas has contacted the school. The beacon for lighting at 7.30 is being prepared.

Members reports The Clerk was asked to contact both FI and Wockhardt to request they alter the angle of their lights which are dazzling motorists causing a hazard.
