## Is-y-coed Community Council Draft Minutes (November 2025)

Details of some items discussed at the Council Meeting held on 18th November 2025 at the Is-y-coed Village Hall.

### **Matters Arising**

- 1. Village Hall the Clerk reported that the 2 x electric hand driers had been returned and refunded as they were too powerful for the electricity supply in the washrooms.
- 2. P/2025/0719 Lower Oak Farm, Oak Rd, lawful development certificate for existing use- siting of 2 storage containers. It was noted that comments submitted relating to this application had since been withdrawn with WCBC as the wrong containers had been identified at the meeting.

#### **Finance**

b) Draft Budget 2026-27. The Clerk presented a draft budget for 2026-2027, together with information on the required precept to meet that budget. This was considered and following discussion the draft budget and precept were approved. The budget for 2026-2027 was agreed at £22,760. The precept was agreed at £21,000 which equates to £90.13 per band D property. The slight shortfall in precept against budget coming from reserves.

### Village Hall

Members were updated on hall bookings.

It was agreed to purchase better paper towel dispensers for the washrooms.

Improvements to the exterior car park lighting have been made.

The 'Carols around the Christmas tree' event takes place on Sunday 7th Dec starting at 6pm with lights switch on at 6.30pm. Free mulled wine, mince pies and hot dogs will be available.

The Hub volunteers were congratulated on the successful £1,200 grant application to WCBC warm spaces. This will provide additional equipment for the kitchen.

It was agreed for the Clerk to apply for a PRS Licence for the hall.

**Planning Applications** The following pre-planning consultation was received:

Telecycle Europe for the former McCarthy Haulage site on Wrexham Ind. Estate for change of use from haulage yard storage to a waste recycling facility for the shredding of components.

Members raised a concern over potential excessive noise levels that may be incurred, especially when the plant goes from a single 8-hour shift per day initially, to a double shift per day when the plant is more established. Members would like to know more details about how sound levels will be monitored.

### St Paul's VA School

It was agreed to nominate Cllr Sandra Hinds as the Community Council's representative on the Governing Body.

Correspondence The following correspondence was received and noted:

- a. Paul Rogers, WCBC We received notification that unit 4 outside St Paul's Church was faulty. Our electrician has attended and reported back that the lantern is beyond repair and requires a replacement. If acceptable to you I will instruct the electrician to replace the lantern with a new LED unit. Estimated cost for the lantern £120. It was agreed to fund the replacement lantern.
- b. Andrew Ranger MP info on: 'As you may be aware, the UK Government will be giving £1.5 million of additional funding to Wrexham through the Pride in Place Impact funding. The funding is for the following areas: Community Spaces: creating extending, improving or refurbishing existing community facilities and enabling community organisations to take control or ownership of underused but valued local assets.' It was agreed to pursue a grant application for the village hall when the funding becomes available.
- c. WCBC 'Following on from the 2025 National Eisteddfod, Wrexham Council are working with external groups to create a legacy of the National Eisteddfod here in Wrexham. We are holding some walk in sessions over the next few months for members of the public who wish to share their ideas. I have posters I can drop off and I would be grateful if you could share them across your community.'
