Community Council News for November 2022

Details of some of the items discussed at the Meeting held on 15th November 2022 at Is-y-coed Village Hall. Community Agent Service-Hayley Scott, Community Agent, attended and gave an overview of the Community Agent service and what it can offer. She is currently helping 2 or 3 clients in the Isycoed area. The Chairman suggested a push to publicise the service, which is free to clients, through 'The Issue'. A discussion took place about funding for an afternoon tea on the 19th December. Hayley was thanked for her presentation and left the meeting.

Matters Arising from Minutes

The Clerk had circulated some further documents received concerning the footpath, which were noted, otherwise there were no matters arising.

Crime Report-The Clerk provided a report on crime figures for the local area and another report prepared by the PCSO, who will be resuming this duty from now on. No concerns were raised.

Finance-The Financial Payments submitted by the Clerk were approved.

i.-The Clerk suggested that she be approved to move an amount from the Current account to the Savings account in order to generate some interest as far as possible and this was approved.

ii-The Clerk also advised of the salary increase for Clerks, to be backdated to April 2022, which had been forwarded by NALC and One Voice Wales. Approval for the salary increase was sought and was granted. Village Hall- The Clerk advised on the Caretaker's role, with Mr H Adams now in post. A discussion took place about forthcoming bookings. The Chairman noted that the kitchen refurbishment was now completed and advised that particular thanks were due to Councillors Dennis Edwards and Steve Ellis, Mrs Angela Edwards, Mr John Smith and Mr and Mrs Rob Parnell who had all given their time towards the refurbishment and made it possible. The Clerk is to contact roofers for quotations for the roof, due to concerns about a possible leak. The Clerk advised that the Asbestos survey had now been completed and the risks were identified as extremely low, and about the forthcoming works to the gents toilet. Councillor Edwards raised a discussion about keys for the hall and suggested the use of a keysafe within the hall, which was approved.

Reports from Members

Councillor S Ellis raised a query about the Nags Head pub and site as a fencing issue had been reported. Councillor Morris queried whether the spotlights from Wockhardt were potentially dazzling for some traffic. It was agreed the Clerk shall contact Planning Enforcement team. Councillor Jones raised a discussion point about Christmas decorations and putting on an afternoon tea at the hall. It was agreed that this shall be progressed by Councillor Jones and any expense approved, since this needs to be organised within a short period of time.

Royal Mail Extends Deadline for non-barcoded Stamps

Royal Mail has extended the deadline for using their non-barcoded stamps by six months to 31st July 2023, Alternatively you can swap them for barcoded versions for free through the Royal Mail scheme. In order to swap your 'old' stamps for the new barcoded version complete a Stamp Swap Out form (should be available from your Post Office) and send it back to Royal Mail along with your 'old' stamps. If you have a printer, you can swap out up to £200 of non-barcoded stamps by printing and completing Stamp Swap Out PDF. Send the form back with your stamps free of charge to Freepost SWAP OUT. No other address details or post code are needed. Self-adhesive stamps must be attached to their original backing paper or book and stamps that are not self-adhesive must be stuck to a sheet of paper attached to the Swap Out form.
