

## Early January Bin Collection Services-All Households

Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> Recycling and food waste collections.

Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> Recycling, food waste **and** non-recyclable waste (black/blue bin).

Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> Recycling and food waste collections.

If your recycling bins get full you can leave any extra recycling in solid containers next to your other recycling, but make sure the materials are separated in different containers as normal.

The containers will be left for you to re-use again. Clean, flattened cardboard can be left by recycling containers if it is no larger in height or width than a standard issue blue sack.

If you are not signed up to receive the weekly bin reminder emails then you can check your bin collection dates and categories, plus those of family, friends and neighbours by simply typing in their postcode or street. This information is usually posted on the Wrexham Council website two weeks in advance [www.wrexham.gov.uk/bin-collections](http://www.wrexham.gov.uk/bin-collections). Don't forget that Garden Waste collections only take place monthly in January and February. If you have a real Christmas Tree this can be cut up and placed in your green bin for recycling.

### Recycle your unwanted cables

Do you have a 'cable drawer'? Do you use all the cables in it?  
In the UK, we are throwing away, or holding on to, enough cables to reach the moon and back!

Recycle Your Electricals is bringing back their annual The Great Cable Challenge campaign. A nationwide call to action to tackle the millions of cables and other electricals sitting idle across UK households.

Wrexham Council is partnering with them to help Wrexham households recycle their unwanted electricals and give old cables and other electricals a second life. If all the residents in Wrexham recycled one cable each, we could save at least 675kg of copper from being disposed of and can save valuable copper being lost forever.

By recycling these cables and other old electricals instead of holding onto them, the valuable materials inside these electricals can be reused and recycled into new items including mobile phones, laptops, smart watches, clean energy and even medical equipment.

Residents can take all old cables and electrical items to any of three household Recycling Centres based across the County Borough.
