APOLOGIES: Apologies were given and accepted. It was determined that the meeting was guorate, however as it was the Annual Meeting and only three members present, it was decided to defer a number of the agenda items to the next meeting. It was Agreed that Councillor S. Ellis would chair the meeting.

TO ELECT A CHAIR OF THE COUNCIL AND RECEIVE THE CHAIR'S DECLARATION OF OFFICE:

This was deferred to the next meeting.

TO ELECT A VICE - CHAIR OF THE COUNCIL: This was deferred to the next meeting.

REVIEW AND AFFIRM THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL DOCUMENTS: The following documents of the Community Council were reviewed and reaffirmed with no amendment. i. Standing Orders ii. Code of Conduct iii. Financial Regulations iv. Internal Controls Document 2023-24. It was noted that there is a revised model Standing Order document due.

The Clerk updated further on a response received from Wrexham Council regarding Old Farm.

iii. The report received from the Internal Auditors for the 2022-2023 financial year, was deferred to the next meeting.

VILLAGE HALL: This item was deferred to the next meeting.

CONSIDERATION OF WAYS TO MARK THE CORONATION OF KING CHARLES: This item was deferred to the next meeting. A discussion took place about the flags.

REQUESTS RECEIVED TO CONSIDER ANY PLANNING APPLICATION UNDER TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 (AS AMENDED):

P/2023/0164: Erection of Livestock Building and all associated works- Ridleywood Farm, Holt Road, Ridleywood, Wrexham. No objections were raised.

P/2023/0230: Erection of 2 Industrial Buildings for Class B2 and B8 Use, associated parking, new highway access and landscaping: - Land east of Bryn Lane, Wrexham Industrial Estate, Wrexham. This was discussed, members having consulted the Planning portal, but it was unclear what the height of the buildings proposed was, as there was no document to specify this. The height should not exceed that of neighbouring buildings. Concerns were expressed about the height of buildings on the Industrial estate in recent years.

MEMBERS REPORTS:

Councillor Jones had passed on a request that the school require a flagpole. It was agreed to help with the purchase of a flagpole. The school will be celebrating 150 years next year and any information relating to the history of the village, or the school is requested. The issue of parking at the school was raised and it was agreed to write to the Police to ask for their attendance at school times. The issue of Speed watch was discussed. The Clerk will enquire with neighbouring Community Councils to see if they have a speed watch set up that could be linked to. Councillor Ellis enquired about the flags, if they are to be up all the time, and if it is possible to obtain a Welsh flag. A discussion took place about Old Farm.


